CONSERVATION CORNER

When it comes to conservation, Baldwin Park is truly blessed to have some of the best environmental stewards in the San Gabriel Valley right at Baldwin Park City Hall. Our parks are very nicely maintained and offer a great deal of recreational opportunities to residents of all ages and leisure persuasions.

One of my favorites is Walnut Creek Nature Park, a 4.5 acre space with a reservable picnic shelter, restrooms, wooden play structure, fitness stations and picnic tables. New native plants have given it a nice upgrade.

In recent years we have gotten some fabulous new parks including the Susan Rubio Zocolo Park and some smaller pocket parks. As part of the San Gabriel Valley Greenway Networks, both waterways that flow to the San Gabriel River; Walnut Creek and the Big Dalton Wash, are being developed. They have bike paths which means we don't have to ride our bikes in the street with cars, trucks, stop signs, and stop lights!

I've been so jealous of El Monte because their parks on the San Gabriel Valley River have *access to the river*. I almost cried when I recently saw the new Walnut Creek development; the chain link fence between the Creek and the Nature Park is gone! There are new stairs and ADA ramps leading to the waterway from the park!

Bikes, strollers, wheelchairs, wagons, roller-skates and all walkers will all be able to make their way to the waterway from the Walnut Creek Nature Park! The area next to the

bike path has walking paths, and solar lights. Benches, drinking fountains, and landscaping are coming soon, it's going to be so beautiful!!

Tell your friends that live by the Walnut Creek Nature Park that their property values will soon increase being so close to this special recreational venue. Bikers from more affluent communities already know this and may try to move in, so beware. It is so exciting to be able to share this news and all the changes being made in our own neighborhoods. Our new City Manager Manny Carrillo along with Parks and Recreation Director Maria Moreno have been working on the Greenway project for 20 years.

This two decade collaboration includes LA County, the Army Corp of Engineers, animal and wildlife agencies from both state and local, SCE Edison, and many others; to make this happen.

We can't forget that our very own Cruz Baca also gets credit for working on parks projects and fighting for parks and open space during her time in elected office. It takes years for many of these projects to take root and come to fruition, but we are finally beginning to see what the fight was all about! It's so nice they are still with us to see the fruits of their labor and we're so lucky to have them!

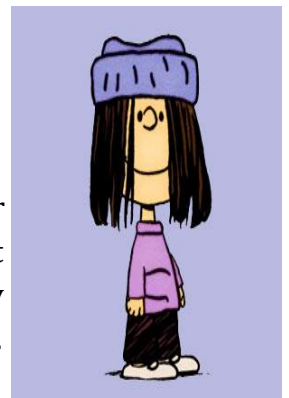

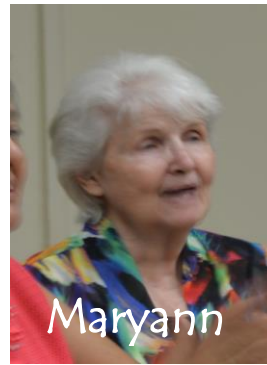
EDNA WHITE

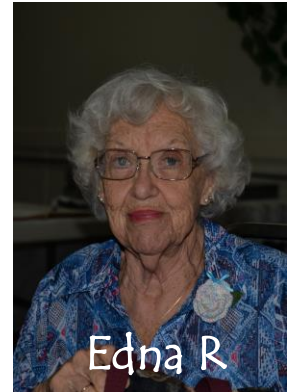
