## HEALTH and WELLNESS

I'm a firm believer that what you eat and drink can build up your immune system and make you stronger to fight strains of different illnesses, such as the "Flu". As we get older, our immunity starts to decline but I'd like to share a few nutrition tips to help keep you stronger:

**1. SWEET POTATOES** - They're a great source of beta-carotene, a Phyto nutrition that supports the respiratory and intestinal health and increases immune cells in the body.

**2. BERRIES** - They're rich in vitamin C, which stimulates production of infection-fighting white blood cells. Eating berries increases levels of disease fighting cells.

**3. BEANS** - Beans are high in Zinc, which helps boost your body's production of white blood cells. It is recommended at least half a cup of cooked beans per week.

**4. NUTS AND SEEDS** - They're rich in vitamin E, which plays a key role by supporting the growth of germ-fighting T cells. Walnuts are an especially good choice, as they have more immune-supporting alpha-linolenic acid than any other nut.

**5. SALMON** - It's one of the few foods that provides vitamin D which plays a huge role in regulating your immune system.

**6. GARLIC** - It's rich in compound called alliin, which may be the source of it's immune-boosting power.

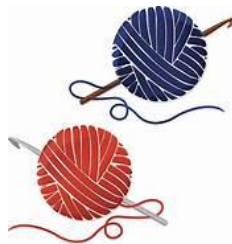

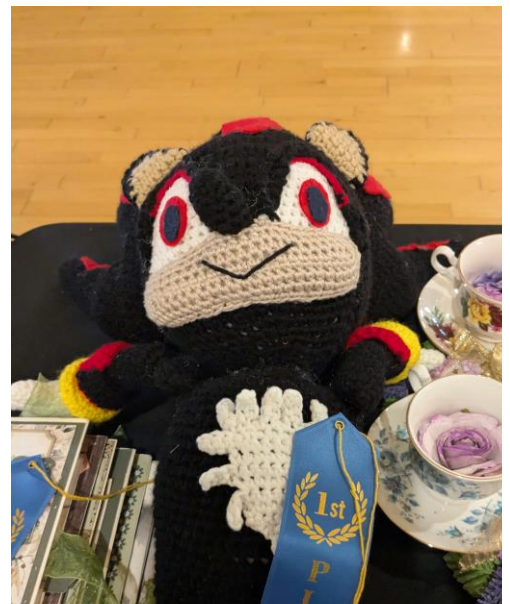


## STUDENT MUSIC COMPETITION
